Divisions will be; a Junior Gold qualifying event for averages minimum 150 for girls and 175 for boys. The other division will be a handicap division 100% of 210 top average. ***New this year is two handicap divisions. 150 and above or 149 and below. Each will have separate prize funds.***

The 2010 Dick Lyke "Grandpa Grouch" Scholarship Tournament Rules

1. This Tournament is open to all YA sanctioned bowlers participating in a certified YA league (including HIGH SCHOOL bowling programs). All youth bowlers participating in this tournament MUST have their YA certification card present at check-in which is one hour prior to the start of the event. Walk-ins are to check in at least thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of the tournament. To compete in this tournament, bowlers must meet eligibility requirements set by YA Rule #400.
2. Tournament Format: All bowlers will bowl a six game qualifier. The first three games will be bowled on the assigned lanes at check-in ***then they will move two pairs to the right or left depending on which lane you are assigned*** for the next three game block. The last two pairs of lanes used will move to the first and second pairs used for the tournament. Then we will cut to the top five qualifiers (boys and girls separately) in **Junior Gold** division for a step ladder final. Ties for qualifying will have a ninth and tenth frame roll off to break ties. Ties will be broken in the step ladder with a ninth and tenth frame roll off. In the scholarship only division handicap will be given for one game per match. Handicap divisions winners will be determined by a payoff of at least a one in ten ratio (1 in 10 ratio) . The Junior Gold Division will be a scratch division.
3. In the Handicap (Scholarship) Division the handicap will 100% of the difference between the bowler's average and 210. Two divisions 150 and above and 149 and below.
4. Bowlers will use their highest **current** YA sanctioned average for a minimum of 12 games. This includes all travel leagues and high school leagues. If no current average as of the time of bowling, the bowler will use the highest Youth Association or Youth division certified average from the 2008-2009 season. If no averages are verifiable, then the bowler will use an average of 210.
5. All bowlers wishing to bowl in the Junior Gold division must be a Junior Gold member prior to competition. All average requirements must be met before the tournament starts. Average minimum for this division is boys 175 and girls 150.
6. Junior Gold qualifiers will be given after the first fifteen bowlers in the boys division and the first fifteen girls, one more qualifier per division for each increment of fifteen more bowlers in a division. If a junior gold qualifier has qualified for a previous entry then the next bowler in the finishing order will receive a qualifying spot from this tournament.
7. Scholarship money will be paid to each division in at least a one in ten ratio. A junior gold qualifying spot will be given for that division with scholarship money given also. Entry fee will be the following; \$16.50 lineage, \$1.50 administrative fee and \$22.00 prize fund. An additional \$10.00 fees will be taken for junior gold division.
8. Indy USBC will added \$100.00 for 150 and above division and \$100.00 for 149 and below division. This money will be included in the prize fund.
9. It is the bowler's responsibility to fill out the necessary forms for all scholarship money after each tournament. Disbursement of scholarship money will be handled through the SMART program. Bowlers winning scholarship money will be notified by SMART on how to receive and use their funds.
10. Only bowlers and tournament officials are allowed in the bowler area during the tournament. If a problem arises, all bowlers on the pair in question are to stop bowling and immediately call a tournament official. Score corrections and other problems are to be directed to a tournament official for resolution.
11. During the tournament all YA codes of conducts will be enforced. Violation of said code will result in disqualification from the event.
12. ***Dress code for this event will be shirts with a collar, or a mock turtle shirt or the official USBC Youth Jersey and dress slacks. No jeans will be permitted. No skirts, no short shorts, tight pants, no hats and no visible midriff on girls. There will be no hats or head covers worn unless okayed by the tournament director. Any questionable attire will be at the discretion of the tournament director.***
13. Any rules not covered will be determined by the United States Bowling Congress rules and regulations.
